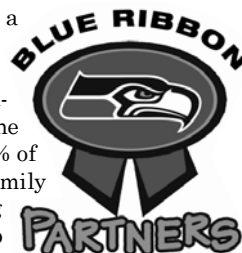

## Fisher Helps Sack Cancer

Kirkland, Wash.—When Seattle Seahawks defensive end Bryce Fisher gets set at the line of scrimmage, looking for the best way to get to the opposing quarterback he is not only looking to help his team, he is also looking to help Gilda's Club fight cancer.

For every sack Fisher records he donates \$1,000 to Gilda's Club.

Fisher's contributions hardly end there. He has also purchased 11 season tickets that are used by the Gilda's Club of Seattle every home game, after which he visits with the attendees. He regularly visits the Club to play with children in NoogieLand and attended their fund-raiser earlier this year where he auctioned off a helmet he signed, fetching \$9,000. Fisher is also planning a golf tournament for June 26 at Newcastle to benefit Gilda's Club.

Fisher's affiliation with the Club came about when his mother was diagnosed with breast cancer in March of last year.
