Edmonds-Woodway atop the Wesco South standings.

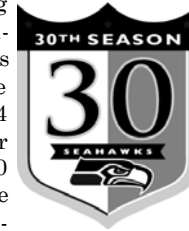

Representatives from the Seahawks, First and Goal Inc. and Qwest Communications cleaned and enhanced the park grounds around the Garfield campus and the Teen Life Center.

There were two sessions during the day. Volunteers' jobs included weeding flower beds and pots, removing overgrown grass and debris from walkways, sweeping stairs, racking leaves and laying new bark.

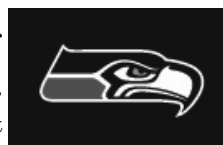
## Making A Difference
